I consent to that happening.*

NOTE: It is in offence under section 127 of the Animal Products Act 1999 to provide false or misleading information in this statement. Under Principle 3 of the Privacy Act 1993 we advise that:

1. This information is being collected for the purpose of providing information to support fitness for human consumption, product traceability and suitability, in accordance with the requirements of the Food Act 1981 and the Animal Products Act 1999; and
2. The recipient and the person that will hold this information is an RMP operator identified in this form. The agency that will collect the information is the NZ Food Safety Authority, P.O.Box 2835, Wellington; and
3. The details will be held by the RMP operator identified in this form; and
4. The collection of information is authorised under clause 3 of the General Requirements for Export; Harvest Statement for Export Bee Products as notified under section 60 of the Animal Products Act 1999. The provision of this information is necessary in order to provide information to support the fitness for human consumption, product traceability and suitability of bee products for export; and
5. The supply of this information is mandatory for the purposes of export with official assurances; and
6. Failure to provide the requested information will result in bee products being ineligible for export with official assurances; and
7. Under Principles 6 and 7 of the Privacy Act 1993, you have the right to access to, and correction of, any personal information which you have provided.

**NZFSA advises that only honey that is extracted from registered apiaries can be made available for sale.**
